

BEGINNING OF THE END

Construction of the flood control channel took out the original hall on Maple St. The County was to reimburse the Club for the loss of its building and property. The lot was zoned for a multiple family dwelling, and the County offer was only \$3,800. The club obtained an independent appraisal of the property's current value, to which the county turned a deaf ear. The Club was forced to go to court in the ultimate folly of taxpayers suing themselves. After a week long jury trail, the Club was awarded \$23,000 — the seed money to go on.
